#### 0

Print some pages. Dojust a couple at a time to start. Later, you can do a half-dozen or more in one sitting.

#### 1

Have your kid sound out all the words on the pages. You can help with the letter sounds, but don't say the words. Make the kid sound them out.

#### 2

Send the kid off to a nice quiet place with a big fat pen to trace all the words. If you must watch, watch from a distance. The kid will digest the stuff better alone.

#### 3

Have your kid sound out all the words with you again. Review the pages the next day and repeat them as necessary.



Don't rush. The tortoise always wins in this race.

#### HINT

Coming down the home stretch. In this book we cover common endings like ED and ING, together with some simple compound words.

Again, all you have to do is what you've been doing. Encourage the little guy to split each word into parts and to assign a single sound to each part. But note that the first part may be a little bigger than before: HAN and DY to make HANDY, or ROCK and ING to make ROCKING.
